Thirty years ago Carole Dean took a \$20 bill and turned it into a \$50 million dollar a year business when she reinvented the tape and short end industry in Hollywood, NYC and Chicago. Carole coined the phrase “short ends” and began buying and selling film ends left from production. She was instrumental in the birth of the Hollywood independent film community because she offered film to Indies at prices they could afford, allowing many producers to go on to great success; customers like Cassavetes took chances with her raw stock and succeeded.

Between 1994 to 1998 Carole produced over 100 television programs, including the popular cable program, HealthStyles, where she interviewed some of the biggest names in the industry including: Dr. Deepak Chopra, Dr. Weil and Dr. Caroline Myss.

In 1992 Carole created the Roy W. Dean Grant Foundation in honor of her late father. To date Carole’s grant and mentorship programs have provided filmmakers with millions of dollars in goods and services and have played an instrumental role in establishing the careers of some of the industry’s most promising filmmakers. A sought-after international speaker, Carole is currently touring the U.S. with her popular books, “The Art of Funding Your Film: Alternative Financing Concepts” and “The Art of Manifesting: Creating Your Future” in the form of workshops.
